COMMONWEALTH YOUTH PROGRAMME CONSULTATIVE MEETING INVESTING IN YOUTH (IIY) MEETING- AFRICA REGION NAIROBI ACTION PLAN

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The investing in youth meeting was held in Nairobi, Kenya from 11-14 April, 2011. The meeting comprised two distinctive consultative processes; Strategy meeting and Youth employment meeting.
- 1.2 The meeting was officially opened by Kenya's Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports, Dr. Paul N. Otuoma on behalf of the Prime Minister, Rt. Honourable Raila Odinga and graced by the presence of Commonwealth Deputy Secretary General Ms. Mmasekgoa M. Mwamba. The IIY meeting was attended by delegates from 19 Commonwealth member countries. The delegates comprised senior government officials, youth leaders, youth enterprise practitioners, representatives from intergovernmental organizations, micro-financial institutions as well as staff from the Commonwealth Secretariat.
- 1.3 After the official opening ceremony, delegates were taken on a conducted tour of a project exhibition by the Kenyan Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Youth Enterprise Fund and the National Youth Service (NYS) engineering laboratory.

2.0 Meeting Recommendations

2.1 Strategy Meeting

Participants discussed a wide range of issues relating to youth development in the region. Sequel to the discussion, the following issues and recommendations were made:-

- Ministries/agents, of youth are under resourced. There is the need for advocacy and intensive lobbying to revert this trend. There is the need to show consequences of inaction in allocating more resources to youth development.
- The need for implementation strategies for resolutions of such meetings at country level.
- Participation- It was agreed that member states should make the best use of structures available to them such as National Youth Councils (NYCs), United Nations (UN) and African Union (AU) to ensure meaningful participation of young people.
- It was also revealed at the meeting that some Regional Youth Caucus (RYC) members who are meant to be representatives for the youth lack basic facilities required to make their work more RYCs.
- Sports should be embraced as a formidable strategy for enhancing peace and development
- The need to harmonise the definition of a youth was also emphasised.
- All countries must have youth policies translated into legislation to ensure compliance.
- The need to professionalise and prioritise youth work by member states
- A presentation was made on the integration of sports for peace and development: strategies and actions. The presentation gave more insight on the programmes in place in the region, models, challenges and country experiences. Key issues highlighted in the presentation included the following:-
- The need to use sports to uplift human kind from difficult situations and conflict
- The need to use sports for peace and development as a tool for youth development
- 2.3 The meeting further discussed opportunities in youth development programming. Participants identified strategy areas and partnerships necessary for promoting youth development. Several interventions were identified:-
- Lobbying member governments to establish/strengthen ministries exclusively dedicated to youth development.
- Develop public private partnership frameworks
- The need to establish/strengthen national youth funds
- Establish and strengthen national youth councils



- · Strengthen the RYCs
- Engaging youth in mainstreaming processes and promote accountability
- The need for setting broad bench marks
- Promoting Youth volunteerism as a strategic intervention to ensure that youths get experience in order to be attractive to the job market
- Need for governments to set up youth economic summits
- Need for corporate mentorship across the commonwealth countries
- Aligning youth empowerment to National strategies
- The need to establish/strengthen NYCs and establish a Network of Commonwealth NYCs
- Creative industries like music, dance and drama to be used as formidable field and alternative areas for youth employment
- There should be consideration for training unskilled youth need for vocational training centres
- CYP to build Strategic partnership with other relevant stakeholders such as International Labour Organisation (ILO) and also disseminate the information to member countries
- CYP to have a mechanism for monitoring and evaluating of what is being done in member countries in relation to youth empowerment
- Need to harmonise the definition of youth among Commonwealth countries
- CYP to emphasize and prioritize youth work as a profession and scale up the CYP Diploma to Bachelors and Masters Degree levels.

The above stated interventions were presented in a matrix (see annex)

3.0 Youth Employment Meeting

3.1 The meeting deliberated on the situation of youth employment and trends in the region. Selected countries made presentations on the situation of youth employment in their respective countries.

The following issues and recommendations were highlighted:

- CYP should supplement government efforts to fund youth programmes
- Public/private sectors are constrained in absorbing all job seekers
- Need for CYP to strengthen youth networks
- Need for CYP to support Youth Funds
- Need for governments to give tax holidays and single business permits to young entrepreneurs
- · Mismatch between skill of the youth and market requirement was also noted
- · Need to take care of marginalised youth that do not have formal education but are skilled.
- 3.2 Presentations were made by some enterprise/fund schemes notably; National Youth Employment Programme-Ghana, East Africa Social Entrepreneurship Network, Swaziland Youth Enterprise Fund, MOLIKO Micro-Finance Trust-Lesotho, YES-JUMP-ILO, Kenya Youth Enterprise Development Fund, and Namibia Youth Credit Scheme. This was meant to afford participants the opportunity to familiarise themselves with youth employment interventions and approaches in other countries.
- 3.3 In order to deepen understanding on youth employment interventions in the region and to get a framework for action for youth employment, participants deliberated and came up with the interventions stipulated in the attached matrix.
