CYCN Belize

CYCN Belize has been engaged as partners in the Maya Forest Corridor Coalition and its Maya Forest Corridor Initiative. We have been planning collaborative projects on capacity building on carbon research and development with a focus on climate change advocacy. Approximately 30,000-acre property was at most at risk in the corridor and final arrangements for transfer to the Maya Forest Corridor Trust are now underway. CYCN Belize will now be contributing towards the revision of the conservation action plan for the Maya Forest Corridor landscape.

UPCOMING FOR AUGUST

- Build advocacy of climate change projects in Belize through the CYCN organization in Belize and beyond.
- Develop a climate change action and corridor forum with the Maya Forest Corridor Coalition with a focus on carbon pricing research and development.
- Strength the CYCN Belize membership participation and project agenda as we prepare for delivering the youth declaration in COP26.

Dear Maya Forest Corridor Partners, On behalf of the Maya Forest Corridor Coalition, I just wanted to update you on the latest development with the Maya Forest Corridor initiative. First of all, the purchase of the 30,000 acre property most at risk in the corridor is almost finalized. Final arrangements for transfer to the Maya Forest Corridor Trust are now underway. Thank you for helping us with your support! With respect to the agreement with the Government of Belize, the current administration has insisted that some land taxes will have to be paid on the property but this will be with a discount. The Government has however agreed to an exemption on the stamp duties. There are also some adjustments on the issue of rights to carbon credits. No final agreement has been signed yet with the Government but will keep you updated when that is done. In the meantime, thank you for your continued support and we hope to next work on the revision of the conservation action plan for the Maya Forest Corridor landscape. The COVID situation will require that we seek alternative ways to meet with our community stakeholders especially. Finally, most of you will know that I have just transitioned from the University of Belize ERI to a new position as the Managing Director of the Belize Maya Forest Trust. This Trust is responsible for the management of the 236,000 acres also recently bought for conservation in northwestern Belize, adjacent and south of the Rio Bravo and a sister landscape to the Maya Forest Corridor. In this new capacity, I will continue with my work with the Maya Forest Corridor Coalition of partners.
